

ABDALLAH IBN MUSA.

Abdallah is known only from a note left in a manuscript ([National Library, Paris, Arabe 107, fol. 126v](#)), which states that he was a deacon and that the manuscript belonged to him. The manuscript was copied by a [Copt](#) and completed on 16 [Kanun II](#) 1696 of the Greeks/A.D. 1385, suggesting that the copy was made in Syria. It contains the [Coptic Horologion](#) and the Song of the Three Young Men in the Furnace (fols. 1-132r), an anonymous commentary on John 20:17 ([fols. 132-33](#)), two pieces for the feast of the Epiphany ([fols. 134-62](#)), and the story of Job ([fols. 162-88v](#)).
