

MUYSER, JACOB LOUIS LAMBERT (1896-1956)

A Dutch Coptologist. He was born in the Hague and studied theology and [Egyptology](#) at Fribourg in Switzerland with Eugene Devaud and went to [Egypt](#) in 1920 as a missionary for the African Mission Society. In February 1921 he was ordained a priest in the [Coptic Catholic church](#) and was assigned to the city of Zagazg. He built a typical Coptic [church](#) .named after Saint Pachomius in the city of Faqus

He contributed extensively to research in the history of the church, Bible studies, biographies of [church](#) fathers, and related materials. He wrote in English, French, German, and Spanish. In addition, he mastered Coptic, Greek, Hebrew, and Arabic.

He published numerous articles in both Arabic and European languages. One of his important contributions to [Coptic studies](#) is “Les Pelèrinages coptes en Egypte” (ed. Gérard Viaud, *Bulletin de l’Institut français d’archéologie orientale*, 1979).
